The Chatham-Kent Children's Safety Village has partnered with the Lambton-Kent District School Board, the St. Clair Catholic District School Board and the Conseil Scolaire de district des Écoles Catholiques du Su-Ouest as well as representatives from the Chatham-Kent Police, Chatham-Kent Fire, Chatham-Kent Paramedics Association, Lower Thames Valley Conservation Authority, Chatham-Kent Energy, and the Chatham-Kent Farm Safety Association to write the curriculum for all grade levels.

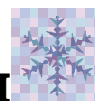
2010 GRADE ONE FALL PROGRAM

Scheduling and Class Size

Each class session is 60 minutes in length.

Each grade will be divided into three separate classes at the Learning Centre where they will have inside and outside classroom instruction with professional educators. These three classes will rotate allowing all students to participate in each of the assigned learning centres designated for the appropriate grade level.

Class times would be as follows:

Period 1: 10:00-11:00

30 minute lunch break

Period 2: 11:30-12:30

Period 3: 12:30-1:30

Buses will leave shortly before 2 p.m. and will be back to their schools by dismissal time.

Please note: Start/end times can be adjusted to accommodate school schedules, travel time, and bus connections. Please advise the Chatham-Kent Children’s Safety Village prior to your visit.

Transportation

All bus transportation is the responsibility of the school. Teachers are encouraged to coordinate classes with neighbouring schools if class sizes are small, and to share transportation costs. (Our programs are capped at 20 per class with 3 classes, so a maximum of 60 students per day).

Fees

There is no charge thanks to the support of the community. The Chatham-Kent Children's Safety Village is a non-profit organization, supported by fund raising initiatives within the community it serves. As a result, the Children's Safety Village is able to provide educational safety programs at no cost to school children in the Chatham-Kent area at this time.

Nutrition Breaks

Food and products are **not** available for purchase; however a picnic lunch may be enjoyed in the day use park area. Please have children bring their lunch, snack and drinks for the day and take home any garbage as we are located in a conservation area and do not have garbage facilities.

Dress Accordingly

Class time will be indoors for educational instruction then some training and hands on will be outdoors so please have the children dress appropriate to weather conditions that day. Proper footwear must be worn for absolute safety on bicycles and battery operated gators and for practicing exiting Sparky's Apartment. Flip flops would not be appropriate.

*During the winter programs, students & chaperones will attend programming outside, please ensure that your students, staff and chaperones are aware.

Please provide **indoor shoes** for rainy or snowy days.

What to bring:

1. Please have everyone bring **PEANUT-FREE, litter less lunches**. All garbage must go home with you.
2. Grade 4 students **MUST bring helmets** to participate in our bicycle safety program.
3. **Grade 6 students will be participating in the farm safety program outdoors in the barn starting in 2010, please dress warmly.**

Chaperone/Student Ratio

Each grade will require a minimum of **1** Chaperone per **5** students. Please ensure that your Chaperones **DO NOT** bring other children with them such as siblings that are not part of the class as they will not have an opportunity to participate. Each of our programs are age specific and geared for a targeted audience.

Chaperone Involvement

Chaperones are asked to monitor and assist with supervising the Village activities with their assigned students. When the students are riding motorized vehicles and/or bicycles around the Village they will require close supervision, and when the students are in small groups they will also require monitoring.

Please assist the instructors with the hands on portion of each class to ensure that each child has an opportunity to experience each life saving technique.

Student Conduct

Your visit is expected to be a fun learning experience. Students are required to follow appropriate rules of conduct as expected at school. Students are to follow safe practices during all activities.

INVITATION FORM TO ATTEND

This form is to invite your class to visit the Chatham-Kent Children's Safety Village for the 2010-2011 school programs.

Please remember the following key points:

- Professional educators will instruct grades 1, 4, and 6 incorporating each of the target safety programs according to specific grade level where children will spend a full day at the Chatham-Kent Children's Safety Village in the C.M. Wilson Conservation Area between 10:00 a.m. – 2:00 p.m.
- Grade **4** students are to bring their bicycle helmet.
- There is no charge for this program, however, transportation must be provided by your school.
- Please ensure that each child provides his/her own nutrition break lunches, snacks and drinks as there are no vendors on site.
- All classes attending the Chatham-Kent Children's Safety Village must supply an appropriate number of parent volunteers. It is **mandatory that one teacher/parent volunteer for every 5 children** are in attendance to provide adequate supervision and to assist with the educational program.
- All students must wear name tags and due to time restrictions, students must have their name tags on *prior* to arriving at the Safety Village
- Please dress according to weather conditions for both inside and outside educational training and instruction.
